Famous film tracing the experiences & disillusion of young people in early post-war years...with Zbigniew Cybulski, the 'Polish James Dean'.
- Friday 3 February : 'False Weight' Colour. Germany. 1971. Director: Bernhard Wicki.
Set in Austria before World War I. A bureaucratic inspector clashes with village folk.
- Friday 17 February : 'Yaketty Yak' Australia. 1973. Director: Dave Jones.
With John Flaus, Peter Carmody. An hilarious spoof of 'intellectual' film criticism. Well known critic John Flaus appears in the film, and will be at the screening. A fascinating discussion evening.
- Friday 3 March : 'Nathalie Granger' France. 1974. Director: Marguerite Duras.
With Jeanne Moreau, Gerard Depardieu. A cool feminist look at the bored French bourgeoisie.

Little-seen film about personal relationships by a major young Australian talent
Followed by: 'We Shall Not grow old Together' France. 1972.
Director: Maurice Pialat. French film with similar theme to 'Drifting'.

- Friday 7 April : 'King of Marvin Gardens' USA. 1975. Director: Bob Raefelson.
With Jack Nicholson, Bruce Dern, who are shiftless brothers caught in a network of bizarre events.
- Friday 21 April : 'The Last Tycoon' USA. 1977. Director: Elia Kazan.
With Robert de Niro, Jack Nicholson, Ray Milland, Jeanne Moreau, Robert Mitchum.
Based on F.Scott Fitzgerald's last novel, a powerful Hollywood story of a ruthless movie mogul and his stars.
- Friday 5 May : 'Jules and Jim' France. 1962. Director: Francois Truffaut.
With Jeanne Moreau, Oskar Werner, Henri Serre. Perhaps Truffaut's finest film, about two close friends in love with the same girl.
- Friday 19 May : 'Sudden Wealth of the Poor People of Kambach'. Germany. 1971.
Director: Volker Schlöndorff. Rebellion against Poverty in Hesse in 1821.
Schlöndorff's 'Coup de Grace' & 'Katherina Blum' were hits at recent Festivals..
Followed by: 'The Mouth Wide Open'. France. 1974. Director: Maurice Pialat.
A moving story of a family whose mother is dying of cancer.
- Friday 23 June/ : 'Days of Hope' A magnificent four-part programme of the
